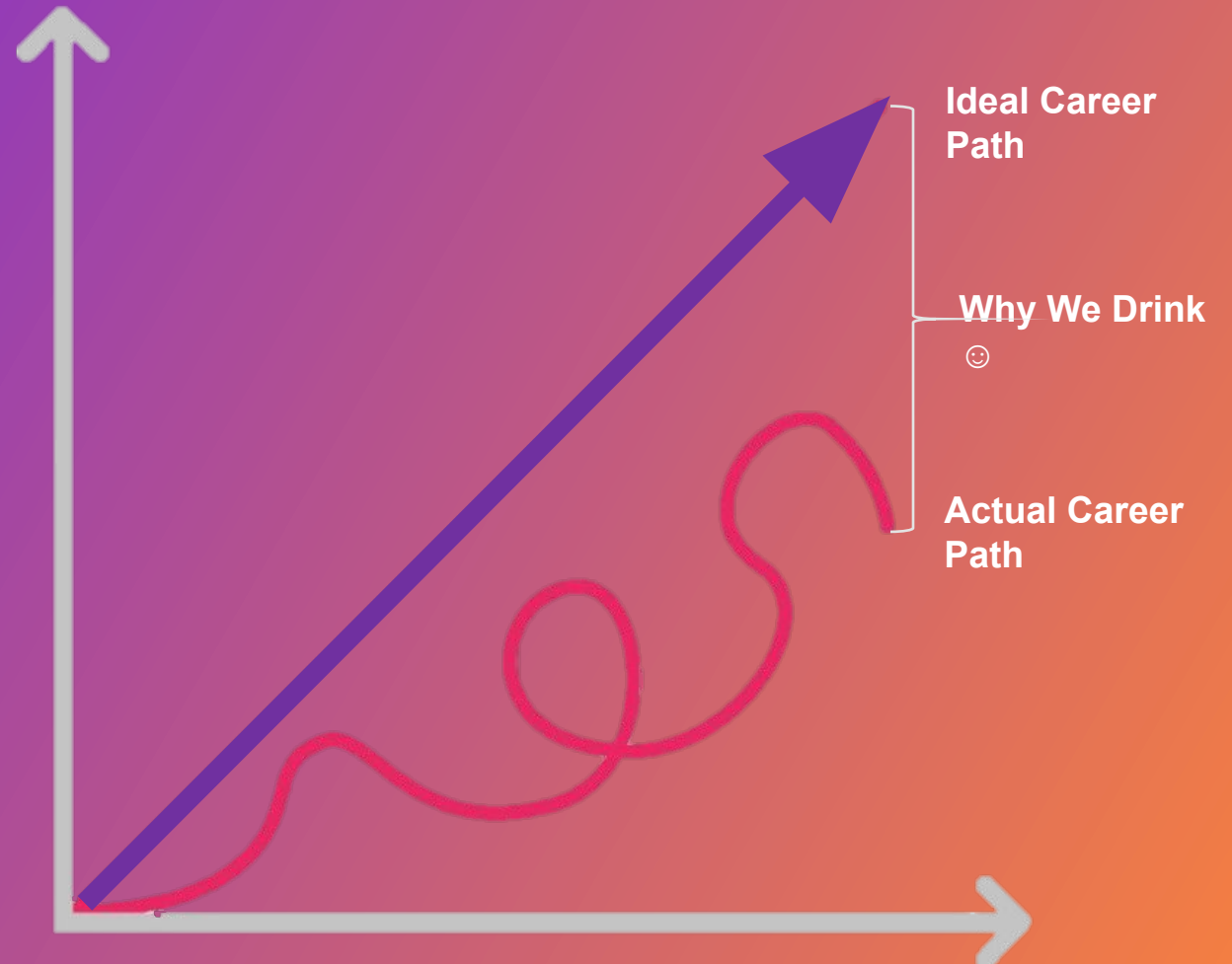
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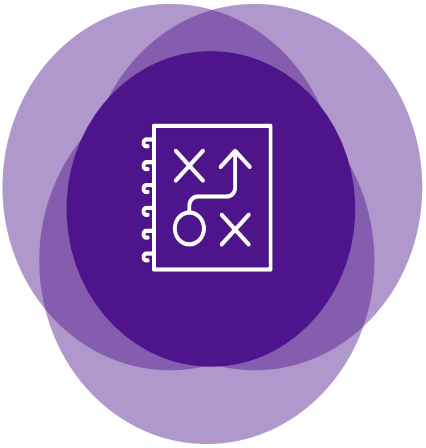
# Death of Linear Career Path

3. Gone are the days when a **single trajectory from Intern to CEO** defines success.



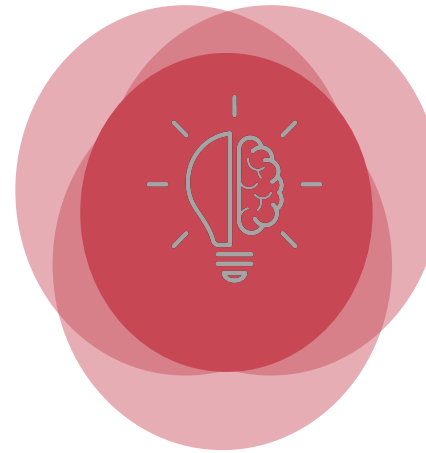

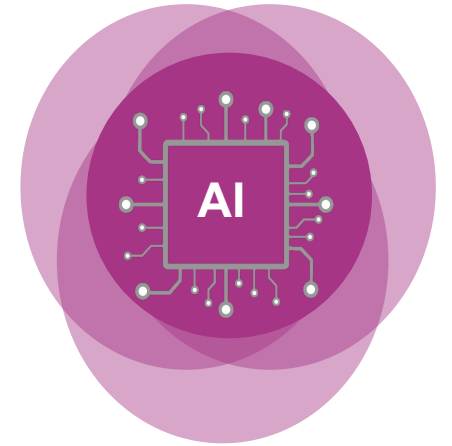
